

(1) Canigetalooploup (Sweet Lou-Continual Velocity-Real Artist)

Canigetalooploup finished third in the second Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination on Friday, October 20. She led early, yielded to sit in the pocket and ended up six lengths behind winner Geocentric, timed in 1:52.1.

Her sire Sweet Lou raced in the Breeders Crown four times. He was the winner of the 2011 2-Year-Old Colt Pace, second in the 2012 3-Year-Old Colt Pace, sixth in the 2013 Open Pace, and the runner-up in the 2014 Open Pace.

She has a record of 3-2-3 from 13 starts, has earned \$130,674 and has a mark of 1:50.4 taken at The Red Mile. Her wins came in a Pop-Up series event at The Meadows, a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes leg at The Meadows and her Bluegrass Stakes split in Lexington.

Trainer Ron Burke is second all-time in Breeders Crown in number of trophies (18) and earnings (\$11,399,650). He won the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace in 2017 with Youaremycandygirl and in 2018 with Warrawee Ubeaut.

Canigetalooploup is owned by Burke Racing Stable LLC. (Sylvia Burke), Larry Karr, Phil Collura and Weaver Brusceci LLC. (Mark Weaver and Michael Brusceci). Burke Racing Stable and Weaver Brusceci LLC. are the second- and third-winningest owners in Breeders Crown history in terms of trophies (13 for Burke Racing and 12 for Weaver Brusceci) and earnings (\$8,461,306 for Burke Racing and \$7,319,974 for Weaver Brusceci). Phil Collura is a four-time Breeders Crown winner, and Larry Karr has won one final.

Canigetalooploup is a Burke Racing Stable LLC. and Weaver Brusceci LLC. homebred and would be their first champion as breeders. Canigetalooploup's full sister Continualou won her elimination and was fourth in the final of the 2020 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace and Canigetalooploup's second dam Extreme Velocity captured the 1997 Breeders Crown Mare Pace final.

Quotes from trainer Ron Burke - "She's a hard horse to handle. It was a tough spot, the slow half hurt her, but she dug in and finished third, so I was happy. She's got to learn. But starting [the final] from the rail, people are going to have to respect her speed."



(2) Geocentric (Sweet Lou-Geometry-Somebeachsomewhere)

Racing in the second Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination on Friday, October 20, Geocentric moved from the pocket to the lead in the second quarter and went on to win by a length and three-quarters in 1:51.

Her sire Sweet Lou raced in the Breeders Crown four times. He was the winner of the 2011 2-Year-Old Colt Pace, second in the 2012 3-Year-Old Colt Pace, sixth in the 2013 Open Pace, and the runner-up in the 2014 Open Pace.

Geocentric has won all nine of her starts so far, has earned \$549,251 and has a mark of 1:49.3 taken at The Red Mile. She won two Pennsylvania Sire Stakes legs and the Championship of that event, three Kentucky Championship Series prelims and the Championship and her International Stallion Stakes division in Lexington.

Trainer Brian Brown is a two-time Breeders Crown winner.

Geocentric is owned by Milt Leeman, Alan Keith, Jim Stambaugh and Joe Sbrocco. Sbrocco has two Breeders Crown victories, while she'd be the first for the other members of the ownership group.

Bred by four-time Breeders Crown winner Diamond Creek Farm, Geocentric sold for \$55,000 at last year's Standardbred Horse Sale. Geocentric's second dam See You At Peelers won her elimination and the final of the 2010 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace.

Quotes from driver Tim Tetrick and trainer Brian Brown -

Tetrick: "She got a beautiful trip. She's strong as can be, and that was a big mile tonight. She's a winner. She just loves to win. She's easy to drive, gives me so many options, and she loves her job. She's just a great horse."

Brown: "From day one, everything has been right. She's just a good horse. You have to like pretty much everything about her, especially her willingness. Timmy tonight didn't pull her plugs. I think only maybe one race did he pull her plugs, in the final of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes. It's been a hell of a ride so far."



(3) Behest (Downbytheseaside-Endowment-American Ideal)

A daughter of Downbytheseaside, who won his elimination and was second in the final of both the 2016 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace and 2017 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Colt Pace, Behest had a second-over trip in the first Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination on Friday, October 20 and wound up fourth. She was 2 1/4 lengths behind winner Pass Line and timed in 1:53.2.

Behest has a summary of 2-1-0 from seven starts, earnings of \$29,186 and a mark of 1:53.4 taken at the Delaware County Fairgrounds. Her wins came in a Buckeye Stallion Series division at Delaware and an overnight race at Hollywood Dayton.

Trainer Brian Brown is a two-time Breeders Crown winner.

Behest is owned by Michael Robinson, Joe Sbrocco, Acadia Farms (George Berlin) and Inthegym and V Barbera (In The Gym Partners and Vincent Barbera). Joe Sbrocco has two Breeders Crown victories and John Fodera of In The Gym Partners has won in the Breeders Crown before as co-owner of Ramona Hill in the 2019 2YOFT

Behest was bred by Steve Stewart, Michael Robinson, Robert Mondillo and Steve Cheatham and sold for \$200,000 at the 2022 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Stewart is a five-time Breeders Crown-winning breeder while the others are in search of their initial triumph. Behest's dam, the American Ideal mare Endowment, is a sister to Artspeak, who won his elimination and was second in the final of the 2015 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Colt Pace.

Quotes from trainer Brian Brown - "She raced maybe her best race tonight. She came second-over, had a good tow right up to the front, and raced really good late. She got a little tired, but she's never been a whole mile like she raced tonight. Hopefully, she will be even better next week. It's a little tough tonight, cold and windy.

"She got a late start, but she's coming around."



(4) Pass Line (All Bets Off-Breakheart Pass-Western Hero)

Pass Line, a daughter of four-time Breeders Crown finalist All Bets Off, won the first Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination on Friday, October 20 by a quarter of a length from first-over in 1:53.

Pass Line hasn't missed the board in 12 starts, compiling a 10-1-1 resume with earnings of \$390,948 and a mark of 1:49.3. She won four preliminary legs in the Ontario Sires Stakes Gold Series at Woodbine Mohawk Park and Flamboro Downs, the Super Final of that event at Woodbine Mohawk Park, her Champlain Stakes division at Woodbine Mohawk Park and her Battle of the Belles elimination at Grand River Raceway.

Trainer Ron Burke is second all-time in Breeders Crown in number of trophies (18) and earnings (\$11,399,650). He won the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace in 2017 with Youaremycandygirl and in 2018 with Warrawee Ubeaut.

Pass Line is owned by Burke Racing Stable LLC. (Sylvia Burke), Weaver Brusceci LLC. (Mark Weaver and Michael Brusceci) and Frank Baldachino. Burke Racing Stable and Weaver Brusceci LLC. are the second- and third-winningest owners in Breeders Crown history in terms of trophies (13 for Burke Racing and 12 for Weaver Brusceci) and earnings (\$8,461,306 for Burke Racing and \$7,319,974 for Weaver Brusceci). Frank Baladchino has owned two Breeders Crown champions.

Pass Line is a Burke Racing Stable LLC. and Weaver Brusceci LLC. homebred and would be their first champion as breeders. Pass Line has two siblings - Shouldabeenatd and Birthday - who have raced in the Breeders Crown finals before.

Quotes from trainer Ron Burke - "She raced good. I'll hope for her to be a little better next week. She got a good draw, so she'll be OK. She's had a great year. David [Menary] did a great job with her up there [in Canada]. When we sent her up there, we thought she was nice. She's turned out to be way better than nice. She tries hard. She's just a very hard-trying horse.



(5) Camerican (American Ideal-Camille-Camluck)

Competing in the first Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination on Friday, October 20, Camerican rallied from fifth to third in the last quarter to make the final. She was three-quarters of a length behind winner Pass Line and timed in 1:53.1.

Camerican's sire American Ideal was second in his elimination and seventh in the final of the 2005 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Colt Pace.

Camerican has three wins, five seconds and two thirds in 11 starts, earnings of \$190,612 and a mark of 1:50.3 at The Red Mile. Her victories came in two New York Sire Stakes legs at Batavia and Yonkers and her International Stallion Stakes division in Lexington.

Trainer Ron Burke is second all-time in Breeders Crown in number of trophies (18) and earnings (\$11,399,650). He won the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace in 2017 with Youaremycandygirl and in 2018 with Warrawee Ubeaut.

Camerican is owned by Burke Racing Stable LLC. (Sylvia Burke), Larry Karr, M1 Stable LLC. (Michael Brusceci, Robert Cook Jr., Rupert MacKenzie and Jack Piatt III. Burke Racing Stable is the second-winningest owner in Breeders Crown history in terms of trophies (13) and earnings (\$8,461,306). Larry Karr has won one Breeders Crown final, and she'd be the first champion for the other owners.

Camerican is a Burke Racing Stable LLC., Weaver Brusceci LLC., M1 Stable and Piatt homebred and would be their first champion as breeders. Camerican's dam, the Camluck mare Camille, was a three-time Breeders Crown Mare Pace finalist from 2012 through 2014.

Quotes from trainer Ron Burke - "She raced real good. She was a little steppy, we'll have to do a little equipment tinkering for this track, and she'll be good. She's had a great little year. She's just kept getting



better all the way along."

(6) Its A Love Thing (Bettor's Delight-Love For Sail-Captaintreacherous)

Its A Love Thing was in the first Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination on Friday, October 20. She brushed to the lead in the backstretch but faded to fifth in the final quarter. She was three lengths behind winner Pass Line and timed in 1:53.3.

Its A Love Thing's sire Bettor's Delight won the 2000 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace (elim and final). He was second in his elimination and fourth in the final of the 2001 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Colt Pace.

Its A Love Thing has a record of 6-2-1 from 11 starts with \$378,527 banked and a mark of 1:50.2 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Her wins came in an Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots Series division, two Ontario Sires Stakes Gold Series legs, a Champlain Stakes split and her elimination and the final of the She's A Great Lady Stakes. All those events were at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Trainer Dave Menary is in search of his first Breeders Crown trophy.

She's owned by Eric Good, Thomas Biederman and Joshua Green. None of her owners have won a Breeders Crown before.

Its A Love Thing was bred by Marvin and Lynn Katz, along with Al Libfeld, and sold for \$65,000 at the 2022 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Libfeld is in the top ten all-time in Breeders Crown history in both number of winners bred (seven) and earnings (\$3,539,802). Marvin Katz has been a winning breeder in Breeders Crown competition on five occasions. Its A Love Thing's dam, the Captaintreacherous mare Love For Sail, is a half-sister to See You At Peelers, who won her elimination and the final of the 2010 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace.

Quotes from trainer Dave Menary - "That was the first time she's ever seen the front before the head of the stretch. She was pretty keyed up tonight. She was wearing a big trotting bike, but still hitting the bike the whole way. I think we're going to find a better bike and a better trip for her next week, and I think she'll be better than fifth.

"It's been a fairytale. Winning the She's A Great Lady was really special. She battled Pass Line [trained in Canada by Menary for Ron Burke] as a stablemate throughout the year. To have two fillies like that in the same year is pretty exciting.

"She has great desire. She just wants to hunt horses. I said earlier in the year, I wanted her to be known for her talent. Early on, she was famous for having one eye. Now, she has the bankroll and Grand Circuit wins to back up her talent."



(7) Caviart Belle (Captaintreacherous-Eloquent Grace-Well Said)

Racing in the second Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination on Friday, October 20, Caviart Belle went first-over from third on the final turn and wound up finishing fourth. She was 7 1/4 lengths behind winner Geocentric and timed in 1:52.2.

Caviart Belle's sire Captaintreacherous was third in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace final in 2012 and won the 3-Year-Old Colt Pace final the next year.

Caviart Belle has a record of 5-2-0 from 10 starts, earnings of \$175,629 and a mark of 1:50.1 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. She won two legs of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes at Pocono and Harrah's Philadelphia, a Kindergarten Series prelim at the Meadowlands, an Eternal Camnation split and her elimination of the She's A Great Lady Stakes. The latter two events were both at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Trainer Nancy Takter has eight Breeders Crown trophies to her credit, including a triumph with Treacherous Dragon in last year's 3-Year-Old Filly Pace final. She also won the 2014 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace with eventual Horse of the Year JK She'salady.

Buck and Judy Chaffee's Caviart Farms has three Breeders Crown titles.

Caviart Belle was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms Inc. and sold for \$375,000 at the 2022 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Hanover Shoe Farms Inc. is the most successful breeder in event history in terms of earnings (\$20,514,348) and tied with Brittany Farms for trophies with 30. Caviart Belle's brother Ervin Hanover was second in his elim and fifth in the final of last year's Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace. Caviart Belle's dam, the Well Said mare Eloquent Grace, is a half-sister to Breeders Crown finalists Ginger And Fred and Fred And Ginger.

Quotes from trainer Nancy Takter - "She raced pretty good. They went a quick back-half, and she came first-up, and with a long stretch, that probably was not completely beneficial. Especially since she was very sick the last time she raced. But overall, I was pretty happy with her effort. It was a step forward.

She's a very nice filly. She gives a good effort every time she races. She's very laid-back, easy going. She's kind of versatile. You can probably do pretty much anything you want with her in a race. I think she probably would race a little bit better from off a helmet, but most of the time, they usually tend to do that."



(8) My Girl EJ (Sweet Lou-Lucy's Pearl-Well Said)

My Girl EJ was in the second Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination on Friday, October 20 and closed in 25.3 from second-over to grab runner-up honors behind Geocentric. My Girl EJ was 1 3/4 lengths behind Geocentric at the wire and timed in 1:51.2.

Her sire Sweet Lou raced in the Breeders Crown four times. He was the winner of the 2011 2-Year-Old Colt Pace, second in the 2012 3-Year-Old Colt Pace, sixth in the 2013 Open Pace, and the runner-up in the 2014 Open Pace.

She has a record of 3-5-1 from 10 starts, has earned \$249,097 and is harness racing's fastest 2-year-old so far in 2023 by virtue of a 1:49.1 mark taken at The Red Mile. Her wins came in the Arden Downs at The Meadows, a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes split at The Meadows and her International Stallion Stakes split in Lexington.

Trainer Ron Burke is second all-time in Breeders Crown in number of trophies (18) and earnings (\$11,399,650). He won the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace in 2017 with Youaremycandygirl and in 2018 with Warrawee Ubeaut.

My Girl EJ is owned by Burke Racing Stable LLC. (Sylvia Burke), Weaver Brusceci LLC. (Mark Weaver and Michael Brusceci), Elizabeth Novak and Howard Taylor. Burke Racing Stable and Weaver Brusceci LLC. are the second- and third-winningest owners in Breeders Crown history in terms of trophies (13 for Burke Racing and 12 for Weaver Brusceci) and earnings (\$8,461,306 for Burke Racing and \$7,319,974 for Weaver Brusceci). Co-owner Howard Taylor is a four-time Breeders Crown winner, and Elizabeth Novak is looking for her first victory in a Breeders Crown final.

My Girl EJ is a Burke Racing Stable LLC., Weaver Brusceci LLC., and Elizabeth Novak homebred and would be their first champion as breeders. My Girl EJ's brother Lou's Pearlman is a two-time Breeders Crown finalist. My Girl EJ's dam, the Well Said mare Lucy's Pearl, is a half-sister to Reflect With Me, who won the 2019 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace final.

Quotes from trainer Ron Burke - "That's our best filly, I think. It's between her and Pass Line. She raced great, an impossible spot. She drew post eight, but they're not going to get to three-quarters in 1:25 next week. With the stretch here, it gives you a lot of choices to make moves. We thought all along she was our best filly. She's a good horse."



(9) Blue Pacific (Sweet Lou-Miss Jones-Bettor's Delight)

Blue Pacific was shuffled in the pocket on the far turn and into the stretch in the first Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination on Friday, October 20 but found room and got up to finish second. She was a quarter of a length behind winner Pass Line and timed in 1:53.

Her sire Sweet Lou raced in the Breeders Crown four times. He was the winner of the 2011 2-Year-Old Colt Pace, second in the 2012 3-Year-Old Colt Pace, sixth in the 2013 Open Pace, and the runner-up in the 2014 Open Pace.

Blue Pacific has two wins, three seconds and a third in six starts, earnings of \$224,600 and a mark of 1:50.2 taken at Harrah's Hoosier Park. She won the New Jersey Classic final at the Meadowlands and the Kentuckiana Stallion Management at Hoosier.

Trainer Joe Holloway is sixth in Breeders Crown history in number of trophies won (10) and eighth in earnings (\$4,247,874). Holloway took the 2000 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace final with Lady MacBeach.

Owner Marty Granoff's Val D'Or Farms has six Breeders Crown victories and earnings of \$3,378,512, good for tenth all-time in event history.

Blue Pacific was bred by five-time Breeders Crown champion Fair Winds Farm and sold for \$53,000 at last year's Standardbred Horse Sale.

Quotes from trainer Joe Holloway - "She raced good. She didn't have a lot of racing luck, but she raced good. She's been racing very well [this year]. She trained down good, and then I was disappointed because I lost her for the summer; she bucked a shin. I lost a lot of time, but in the end, it worked out because she's fresh now. She's good.

She's got high speed and she tries. She's a nice horse."



(10) Peace Talks (American Ideal-Triple V Hanover-Somebeachsomewhere)

Peace Talks was fifth throughout in the second Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination on Friday, October 20 and wound up finishing in that spot to make the final. She was 9 1/2 lengths behind winner Geocentric and timed in 1:52.4.

Her sire American Ideal was second in his elimination and seventh in the final of the 2005 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Colt Pace.

Peace Talks has two wins, three seconds and three thirds in ten starts and has earned \$218,569. Her victories came in a New York Sire Stakes leg and the final, both at Yonkers.

Trainer Chris Ryder has won five Breeders Crown finals, including the 2021 2-Year-Old Filly Pace with Niki Hill.

Peace Talks is owned by Henderson Farms (Craig Henderson et al.), Jeffrey Bell, Fac Racing LLC. (Frank Canzone) and Robert Mondillo. Henderson co-owned 2010 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace champion Put On A Show while her other owners are in search of their initial Breeders Crown title.

Bred by Donald Robinson, Michael Robinson, Steve Stewart and Robert Mondillo, Peace Talks sold for \$87,000 at the 2022 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Of her breeders, only Steve Stewart (five times) has won a Breeders Crown before. Her dam, the Somebeachsomewhere mare Triple V Hanover, is a sister to former Breeders Crown finalist Took Hanover.

Quotes from trainer Chris Ryder - "I thought she might do a little better. She raced well at the Red Mile, so we figured we would come. She earned her way. She's had a good year."
