M. day before race at Secretary's office to be eligible to start. Meetings limited to advertised dates. Right to reject any entry, postpone on account of weather or change order of program reserved. A nominator may enter and start as many horses in same race as desired by paying entry on each.

M. of day prior to race. Racing dates limited to September 12, 13, 14. National Trotting Association rules to govern. No distance except for foul driving or laying up heats. Entries Close August 26th. Money won that day no bar. A horse may be entered in two classes and pay only for the class in which he starts. Horse distancing the field entitled to one money only. Five to enter, 4 to start. The right is reserved to change order of program, decline any entry or declare off any race.
